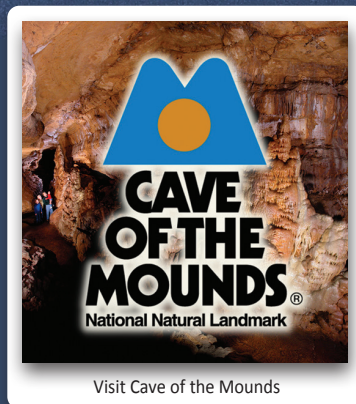

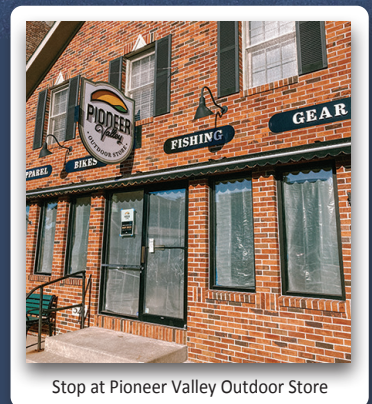

This is an ancient land full of new and exciting life.

A place where fiddlers play, small beer- and wine-makers hone their craft, and local farmers pluck their crops from the rich soil and bring them directly to local markets and restaurants.

There is Norwegian flare in Mount Horeb, Swiss charm in New Glarus and

the rich river culture of Spring Green. There is rapidly-growing Verona, cosmopolitan Middleton-Cross Plains, and charming rural hamlets like Belleville and Paoli. There are the artists of Mineral Point, the famous trout fishing of Black Earth Creek, and the sprawling splendor of Governor Dodge State Park in Dodgeville.

There are wheels of delicious cheese, made from the milk of local cows and according to old world traditions that made their way here with the earliest pioneers. There are one-of-a-kind, locally owned shops, along with parks, trails and spectacular wildlife.

And with typical Midwestern congeniality, the people here want to share the

special things about the Driftless region with people far and wide. The people here are eager to share their culture, their food and drink, their friendship, and of course, their story...

The tale of this part of Wisconsin stretches back into prehistory, to a time when huge swaths of North America and Eurasia were locked under thick slabs of ice. But during the last ice age, a slice of southern Wisconsin was spared. Technically, the "Driftless" area is the southwestern quarter of the state, which was untouched by glaciers during that frigid epoch. The unglaciated area was cut deeply by ancient streams into narrow, twisting valleys and ridges.

As a result, the surface landforms are much older than those in the rest of the state, which was shaped by a relatively recent glacier, carving out a land totally

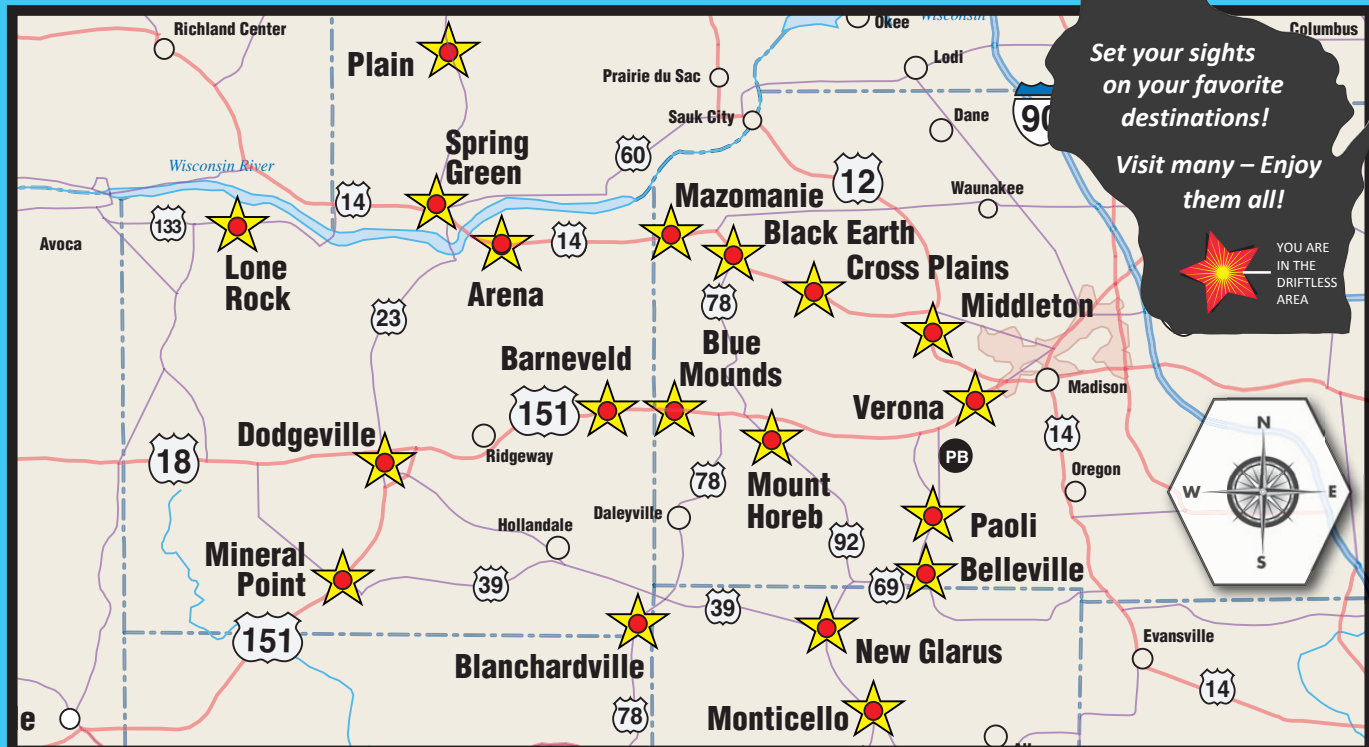

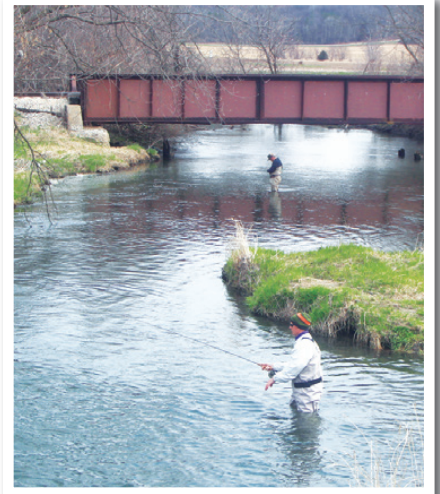

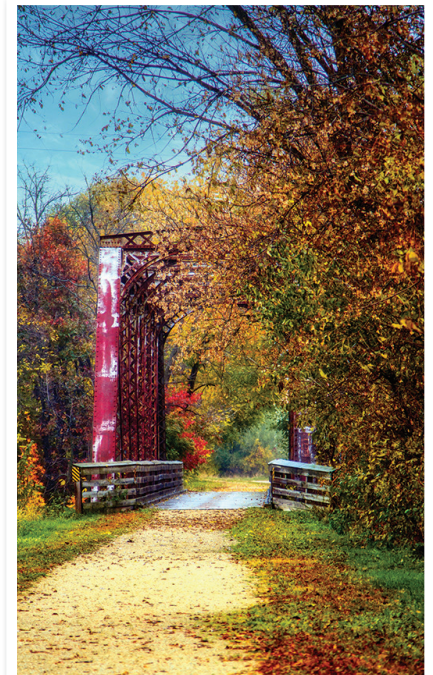

Including Spring Green, Arena, Lone Rock & Plain

Nestled in the scenic Driftless region of the upper Midwest, formed thousands of years ago in land that was never covered by glaciers, sits the Wisconsin River valley.

Located in southwest Wisconsin, the area is home to unique natural wonders, arts, cultural landmarks and exceptional dining and shopping experiences. From the gateway to the River Valley in Arena, historic Lone

Rock, to the hills of Plain and diversity of Spring Green, the area is a magnet for nature lovers as well as art lovers, whether for a day, a week or a lifetime.

The natural beauty of the rolling hills, prairie and Wisconsin River valley are home to flora and fauna galore. Whooping cranes, sandhill cranes, eagles, other cranes and pelicans, herons, song birds, many species of turtle, including the threatened Blanding's turtle, snappers, painted and wood turtles, rare cacti and grasses are only the beginning. Hiking is a popular pastime at the Nature Conservancy just north of Spring Green. Trips along the river in canoes or inner tubes offer an up close look at nature that few spots can rival. Fishing along the river is another popular pastime, summer or winter.

Just over 20 miles west of Madison on Highway 14, the Village of Arena boasts two beautiful parks which feature a ball diamond and a fishing pond at West Park. A dog park and archery range are open to the public. The village has a large cheese factory where visitors can watch cheese being made.

Further along Highway 14 is Lone Rock, which is also home to two beautiful village parks. Battery Park, commemorating those who lost their lives in the Civil War. Firemen's Park, located on the south side of the village, has a splash pad for children that offers a zero depth water experience that will cool off the little ones. There are even benches for parents and grandparents to sit and enjoy. Ball diamonds, horseshoe pits, large shelter and scooter/skate area are also amenities.

Plain is nestled amid valleys and bluffs along Highway 23 in central Sauk County. The village park features a swimming pool along with a ball diamond, sand volleyball court and shelter. The nine-hole Westbrook Hills Golf Course is a favorite spot to play a

Spring Green Arts & Crafts Fair

The Spring Green Arts & Crafts Fair will return this summer on Saturday and Sunday, June 25 and 26. With more than 50 years of service to community, the fair has raised well over \$1 million that has been donated back to the community in grants, scholarships, publicity and profits for service groups who provide food for the fair.

Born over a bridge game as a way to promote Spring Green in a "nice, clean, family way," according to a report in the *Home News* weekly newspaper from that time, the fair has grown to become an institution cherished by the community and those who benefit from the fair. The primary mission of the fair is to support the arts in the River Valley area.

Recipients of fair grants have included the Spring Green Community Library, Gard Theater, River Valley Players, Rural Musicians Forum, American Players Theatre, Bloomin' Buddies garden club, River Valley School District, Spring Green Area Chamber of Commerce, Taliesin Preservations, St. John's School, Spring Green parks, Wyoming Valley Cultural Arts Center and many others. A scholarship was established in 1971 to help River Valley High School students attending secondary school in the arts pay tuition for college.

few holes on a warm summer day. Not to be missed is St. Anne's Shrine and grotto located on a remote hilltop.

Spring Green is located at the heart of the River Valley area. It is home to art galleries, unique shops and restaurants in addition to two village parks. North Park includes a municipal swimming pool, large shelter and ball diamond. The Spring Green Golf Course makes a nice spot to take a break in the sun and play a few holes.

South of Spring Green is Wyoming Valley, where one will find American Players Theatre, one of the Midwest's premier repertory theaters. Taliesin, the home of world renowned architect Frank Lloyd Wright, is open May through November for tours. The House on the Rock, one of the state's most popular visitor destinations, is located just up the road from Taliesin. The Wyoming Valley Cultural Arts Center on Highway 23 is the only school ever designed by Wright.

The Ice Age National Scenic Trail

The Ice Age National Scenic Trail is a thousand-mile trail that traverses the length of Wisconsin from east to west. Not surprisingly, the Ice Age Trail is known for its glacial features, such as eskers, moraines, and kettles. Four of the segments run through the Sugar River Area.

Madison Segment

This surprisingly remote feeling 3.0-mile segment passes unobtrusively through a scenic golf course and residential neighborhoods.

Verona Segment

This suburban, 6.4-mile segment makes good use of three county parks and links up to a variety of additional hiking and biking trails in the Trail Community of Verona.

Montrose Segment

This 7.5-mile segment has two distinct experiences: a jaunt down a quiet multi-use rail trail and a beautiful off-road trek featuring dense forests, bedrock outcroppings, restored prairies and long views.

Brooklyn Wildlife Segment

This 3.3-mile segment follows a rolling course over glacial outwash and bedrock hills through the Brooklyn State Wildlife Area. It features woodlands, prairie, and marshland overlooks.

New Glarus has a picturesque downtown featuring charming architecture and is home to interesting locally-owned

shops, as well as many fine bars and restaurants. There are a wide variety of dining options in the quaint village, including many dishes based on family traditions. European specialties Schnitzel, Geschnetzelets, Rösti potatoes, and the perennial favorite Swiss Fondue are delicious. There are also a wide variety of tasty options from sandwiches, burgers, and pizza. The New Glarus Bakery offers yummy desserts year-round! To accompany your meal, or to take home, the New Glarus Brewing Company offers a wonderful selection of world class beers, including the favorite Spotted Cow!

Just west of the Village of New Glarus on Highway 39 is Bailey's Run Vineyard. Visitors are invited to enjoy great wine and a friendly atmosphere, including the beautiful expansive porch.

New Glarus area businesses are full of award-winning cheeses and meats, breads and pastries, wines and beers, and maple syrup, many of which are served at the local restaurants. Visit an area cheese fac-

tory and find out just how cheese is made. Green County is home to the only cheese factory in the United States that produces Limburger, a potently aromatic but mild (in flavor) delicacy.

story of Swiss colonists, but also shows the evolution of agriculture and dairying and explains New Glarus' transformation into a tourist destination.

The museum's 14 buildings include a cheese factory, a one-room schoolhouse, a print shop, an authentic 1850's cabin, and a replica of the community's first church. Be sure to spend some time in the Hall of History, which features a brand-new display chronicling the history of New Glarus and the ways that the original immigrants shaped our community.

The Village of Monticello lies between Monroe and New Glarus on State Highway 69. From the picturesque Lake Montesian, to the two bike trails and the beautiful Montesian Gardens, Monticello is great place to kick back and enjoy small-town hospitality. Only 30 miles south of Madison, Monticello offers proximity to the city and the peace and wonders of the country.

There are great places downtown to grab something to eat or enjoy a beverage, along with three nearby cheese factories that offer samples of their award-winning cheeses.

The Sugar River Trail and Badger Trail intersect just east of the village, making biking easy and a great way to enjoy wild-life and natural areas nearby.

In July, true small-town flavor is celebrated with the Monticello Homecoming. Softball, volleyball, canoe races (the only rule is there is no rules), Tug O War, and many other activities await. Then there's the food: enjoy pies ... so many pies, and the Lions Club's famous hand-dipped deep fried cheese curds, as well as lots of other tasty treats. On Saturday night the sky lights up with fireworks! Sunday afternoon's parade is a picturesque celebration of life in a small town.

Monticello offers a welcome to the place where there is a feeling of home, no matter where you hail from.

Blanchardville – On the peaceful Pecatonica

Come experience charming small-town living and good old-fashioned fun on the peaceful misty Pecatonica River in scenic Southwest Wisconsin, on the road to Yellowstone Lake State Park. They're a valley village on the eastern tip of the unique geological feature known as the Driftless Area, and a friendly gateway to the hills and valleys created by streams and rivers, missed by the glaciers that flattened so much of the state. Wander the shops of their two-block historic downtown, enjoy fishing from the mowed river bank or handicap-accessible platform, watch a Home Talent baseball game, or just listen to the water tumble over the historic dam next to the old mill which is now our Historical Society building. Learn about their Mormon settlement and their entrepreneurial history at the Historical Marker outside the building and from the exhibits in the building.

The rivers and fertile land first brought Native Americans to the area. Members of the Winnebago Tribe camped near Blanchardville. Settlers had arrived by the time Wisconsin became a state in 1848. At that time, Samuel Horner built a grist mill on the Pecatonica in the village. Around 1850 a Mormon colony was established in the community, named Zarahemla. In 1855, village namesake Alvin Blanchard purchased the village mill and surrounding land and with an entrepreneurial spirit that continues in the village today, and started assembling the village that took his name at the time of incorporation in 1890.

Now, they have a Farmers Market in the center of Main Street the 2nd and 4th Saturday mornings of the month in May through October. There is a playground for kids and two covered shelters in McKellar Park for family picnics that can be reserved with Amy, the village clerk at blanchvilclerk@tds.net. Grab a beer, an ice cream, a cappuccino or a burger and sit on the benches under the Ryan Park Gazebo to watch tractors, Amish buggies, antique cars, UTVs and Harley Davidson motorcycles cruise through town. The curvy country roads are popular with just about everyone, if you don't mind driving in a county with no stop lights and more cows than people. All of the roads are open to ATV/UTVs and are near the Cheese Country Trail and the Pecatonica State Trail.

They love visitors and have lots of places to stay in and near town! Choose one of their historic Airbnbs, Hipcamp farmstays, or RV in the village campground along the Pecatonica River. You can even stay in guest rooms above

a haunted bar! If you stop to buy gas, browse the antique store, taverns, restaurants, home décor and custom sign shop, hardware and bait store, grocery store, coffee and ice cream shop. Bring friends and host a party in their historic Main Street event venue. While you're here, stop and take a photo in front of the historic postcard mural on the old car dealership building on the south side of town. Share your snaps and tag them! #onlyinblanchardville #smalltownbigheart #blanchardvillewi

They are a lively community and welcome you to join them for one of the many annual events like the Father's Day Chicken Barbecue or the Cruis'n Wisconsin Car, Motorcycle &

Truck Show. They have one of the largest and most rambunctious alumni homecoming celebrations around, bi-weekly summer evening concerts in downtown Ryan Park, a community Christmas on Main celebration with firetruck rides and a visit from Santa. Check for a list of events on Blanchardville.com.

The Pecatonica River offers over 90 miles in total of gentle watersports, with canoe rentals available and tubing nearby. All summer long people are fishing along the riverbanks and by the dam near their historical society/former hydroelectric and grist mill. This is the longest unrestricted flow of water in the state of Wisconsin. The river loops back and forth through valleys with views of scenic bluffs, scenic farm pastures, and marshes and woods. The river and adjoining branches offer excellent trout and game fishing, along with natural habitat for wildlife, including many birds and mammals.

Yellowstone Lake State Park offers a 455-acre game fish stocked recreational lake with ample space for swimming, fishing and boating, along with park lands for hiking, camping and picnicking. In winter, the lake is open for ice fishing, and the park lands are open for cross-country skiing and snowmobiling. Canoe, rowboat and paddle boat rentals are available at the lake.

Blanchardville Community Pride

Blanchardville Community Pride is a volunteer organization whose purpose is to protect and enhance Blanchardville's commercial area, dating back to the early beginnings of the village.

Though the town may not be the same buildings and structure as her grandmother knew, a stop in Blanchardville will find the warm-hearted community she loves and an adventure awaiting!

Rachel & Ray's Pub & Grill operates in one of the earliest buildings constructed in Blanchardville. Built in the late 1860's, by town founder Alvin Blanchard, the three-story building still operates as a hotel. From the days of horses, buggies and trains to now of automobiles, many of traveler's paths have crossed these floors. Whether you're looking for a quick place to stay for the night or an historic experience, stop in the bar and book a night at Hotel Blanchard. As they say "old places, have old friends" you never know who you might meet!!

You will fall in love with the tranquility of the vast farmlands, the myriad of local activities, our strong Norwegian heritage and our captivating historic district that combine to make Mount Horeb an ideal tourist destination. If you're visiting Mount Horeb, be sure to stop by the Chamber of Commerce Welcome Center to get a map to the attractions. And Mount Horeb's trolls love kids, so be sure to have your family's picture taken with them along the "Trollway," the village's iconic shop and restaurant-dotted Main Street.

Rich in history, Mount Horeb features several cultural festivals each year. The themes range from art to food and beer. Distinctive shops and antique stores, located in authentic restored buildings and Victorian homes, line Main Street.

Recreation is abundant in the Mount Horeb area. Tucked among the deep valleys and farmland of southern Wisconsin, visitors can enjoy camping, fishing, golfing, swimming and a 39-mile recreation trail great for biking, hiking and jogging.

Mount Horeb has seen much growth and change since its earliest days, all while re-

taining its small town charm.

While the community and its shops and people are undoubtedly whimsical, the silliness and mythology are rooted in a deep, more serious love of history. Mount Horeb is home to a thriving and highly active historical society, complete with its own museum featuring everything from ancient artifacts to antique firearms.

According to the Mount Horeb Area Historical Society, land purchases that eventually led to the creation of the village began in 1849, but the community's business center started east of where it is today.

Englishman George Wright gave the town its name in 1861 when, charged with choosing a name for the post office, he decided on the name of the place where the Book of Deuteronomy says God gave Moses the Ten Commandments.

When the railroad came to town, it chose a station site further west than the business district and the look of the town changed

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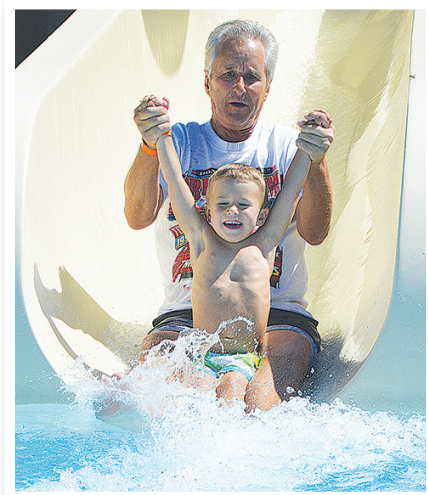

Cave of the Mounds

Cave of the Mounds National Natural Landmark – An Underground Treasure

You are invited to enjoy Wisconsin's great natural outdoor recreation all year-round! The Cave's constant 50-degree temperature provides a cool experience on hot summer days, and warm, dry shelter in the winter.

The Cave lay untouched until its accidental discovery during a routine quarry blast on August 4, 1939. There isn't a natural open-

ing, so you won't find any common cave creatures such as bats. A tour of the Cave takes you past colorful stalactites, stalagmites, columns, underground streams, still pools and other formations. Rent a blacklight and experience the scientific property of fluorescence as you tour the cave. Cave of the Mounds has been called the most significant cave in the upper Midwest, and is commonly referred to as the "jewel box" of America's major caves, for the variety and delicacy of its formations.

Cave of the Mounds is not just a cave – the park grounds on the surface are worth the visit alone. Kids of all ages love the Gemstone Mine and Fossil Dig activities where they can find their own collections of real gem and fossil specimens. Watch as they crack open a Geode in the Rock and Fossil shop. Stroll along a nature trail next to a disappearing stream trickling through the oak valley savanna. Explore the Karst Trail, which leads you to multiple sinkholes. Extensive prairie gardens change with the seasons to offer habitat to insects, birds, and butterflies throughout the year.

"When people look at the art work of others it either speaks to them or it doesn't. If my work speaks to you, what you as a viewer get out of it can be more important than what I as an artist put into it, and that can be magic."

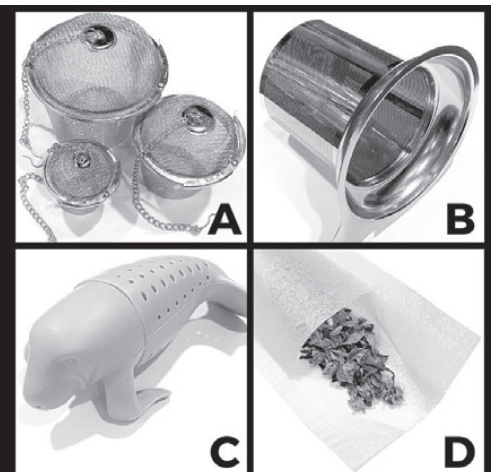

In 1827, Henry Dodge, his family, and about 40 miners began what would become the city of Dodgeville. Dodge made a pact with the local Winnebago Indian leaders so he could build a cabin and smelter. The original community was made up of three separate settlements: "Dodgeville", "Dirty Hollow" and "Minersville". Dodgeville, which was named after Dodge, grew slowly during its early years. It was incorporated as a village in the 1840s. Later a small "war" was fought with Mineral Point over which community would become the seat of Iowa County. At the time Mineral Point was the seat, but Dodgeville residents felt they should have it. Dodgeville eventually won the "war" and Wisconsin's oldest county courthouse. Dodgeville then saw a population boom, and it became a center for mining. Miners from England flooded the city, and the area flourished. British and Cornish architecture is still visible in the city today. Dodgeville became the largest city in Wisconsin at the time, as well as most of the

Midwest north of St. Louis, and west of Cincinnati. The community's boom didn't last long though, and with the decline of mining its population was overtaken by rapidly growing cities like Chicago and Milwaukee. Several factors led to the decline in importance of mining, including the Black Hawk War, the California Gold Rush of 1849, the Civil War, and the emergence of farming, leading to Dodgeville's development as a business and agricultural center.

About the Area

The city of Dodgeville is geographically located among sandstone bluffs, steep hills

and gently rolling farmlands. The surrounding area is referred to as "unglaciated" because it was untouched by the glaciers that shaped much of the region's topography. It is also referred to as the "Driftless region" because the absence of glaciers meant that no "drift" (or accumulated rock and soil) was left behind. Many people simply refer to this area as the "Uplands." By any name, it's no exaggeration to say that the surrounding area is a feast for the eyes with its rugged rock outcroppings, wildflower meadows and prairies, wooded hillsides, lakes, and streams, and rolling farmlands.

Cathryn's Market

Cathryn's Market is located in a building dating back to the late 1800's that they have restored to its original beauty. They offer excellent locally-roasted coffee and espresso drinks and bake a wide variety of items from locally grown organic flours produced in a local mill. The assortment includes cookies, brownies, muffins, coffeecake, and their famous graham crackers. Cathryn's also sells locally produced beef, pork, lamb, chicken, eggs, produce, cheese, breads and many more items. They offer daily breakfast and lunch options and take home heat and eat meals, all using locally grown and produced items. Cathryn's has a beautiful 1930's soda fountain where they make phosphates, ice cream sodas, malts, shakes and sundaes.

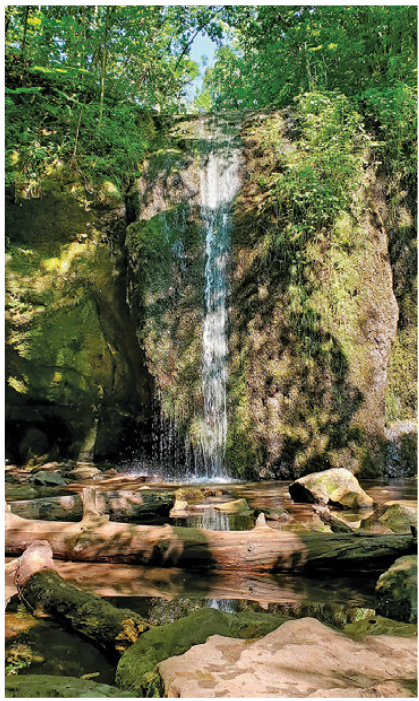

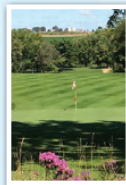

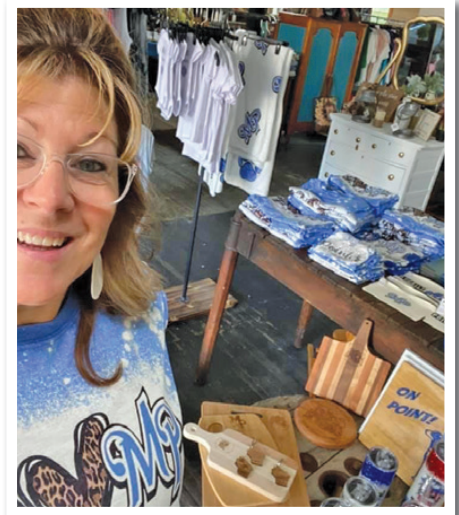

'On the Edge' Gallery

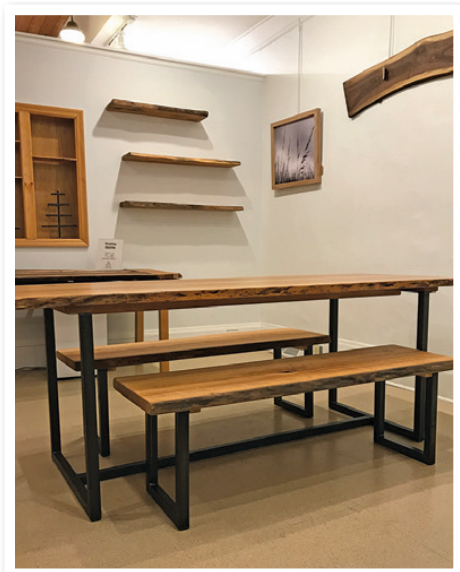
When 100 mile per hour winds ripped through the Driftless region in the summer of 2016, innumerable trees within the 30-acre forest owned by John and Ann suffered and an untimely fate: 75-year-old oak and cherry trees downed by the force. However, through this cataclysmic event, an opportunity arose. The trees from this sustainably managed forest were recovered and milled on site, revealing the beauty that was inherent within. Live Edge Solutions and 'On The Edge' Gallery was born out of the desire to

allow these trees to live on in new form and as reminder of the immense potential of our forests.

By creating home products from rescued trees, the wood becomes viable long-term storage of carbon captured from the atmosphere. Trees remove the green-house gas carbon dioxide from the air and when those trees are sustainably harvested for home products that carbon is captured within the wood itself. In customer's homes, these works provide a visible reminder of the importance of trees and forests in the effort to slow climate change.
